## A Look In The Past 175 Years In Our Parish

Although the earliest available records on our parish date to 1850 when Fr. Thilieres attended to the spiritual needs of the very small number of Catholics in Wauseon, we remained a mission until Thanksgiving Day 1919 when Fr. T.J. Quillan became our first resident pastor. Prior to that Frs. Magenahan and A. Hoefel rode horseback from Defiance about once every four weeks during 1858-1865 to celebrate Mass in various Catholic homes in and around Wauseon. During this same time Mass was also said at a small settlement northwest of Wauseon called Springhill in the Malone and O'Boyle homes.
