From the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops (USCCB):

As the Universal Church looks toward the Jubilee Year 2025, the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops (USCCB) is thrilled to support the Holy Father in this "event of great spiritual, ecclesial, and social significance in the life of the Church."

Pope Francis stated in his February 2022 letter announcing the Jubilee 2025: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us, and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision. The forthcoming Jubilee can contribute greatly to restoring a climate of hope and trust as a prelude to the renewal and rebirth that we so urgently desire..."

The Jubilee Year will offer the faithful opportunities to participate in various jubilee events at the Vatican and in their own dioceses. The great tradition of opening the Holy Door will begin when Pope Francis opens the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica on December 24, 2024. Other holy doors will be opened at the Rome basilicas of St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major and St. Paul Outside the Walls. For pilgrims who cannot travel to Rome, bishops around the world are expected to designate their cathedrals or a popular Catholic shrine as special places of prayer for Holy Year pilgrims, offering opportunities for reconciliation, indulgences and other events intended to strengthen and revive faith.

Pope Francis has asked that the year 2024 be dedicated to a "great symphony of prayer" as the Church prepares for the Jubilee of 2025.

175th Anniversary for St. Caspar Parish

In the coming year, 2025, St. Caspar Parish will celebrate 175th Anniversary of our founding in1850. Today, we are the beneficiaries of this legacy of faith and service. We are commissioned through our baptism to continue to deepen our own faith, share and witness that faith to others, and serve one another in our Lord Jesus. We are called to continue and pass on our heritage of faith and service to future generations.

St. Caspar Parish began in 1850 as a small missionary station church, visited by priests on horseback as they made their way through swamp land and forest. St. Caspar Parish can name 39 priests who have served the ministry needs of the people since 1850. The original Church on the corner of Jefferson and Clinton Streets burned down in 1895, but dedicated parishioners rebuilt on the same site with the help of many other churches in Wauseon.

Our number of families increased from 10 families in 1865, to 116 in 1943, and 225 in the early '1960s when the parish outgrew the downtown church. Because of God's providence and some wise parishioners, we were able to purchase 40 acres of land on Shoop Avenue for \$31,200. Since the new church was dedicated in 1966, we have added the Priest's Rectory, a beautiful Shrine, Prayer Garden, and Stations of the Cross, and expanded classrooms in the church basement.

The desire to have adequate space for many youth and adult religious formation activities has been crucial in each expansion of our building. We have about 30 catechists and aides teaching 3-year-old children through grade 8. Our *LifeTeen* Core Team continues working with our high school teens.

Masses in Spanish and other outreach efforts to Hispanics have been a part of our St. Caspar Parish since 1959. We have a Spanish language Mass every weekend.

Over the years our pastors have been very ecumenically active, and our Parish has hosted a number of Christian ecumenical services and celebrations. Likewise, many cherished organizations, such as the Knights of Columbus as well as the Rosary Altar Society Circles (St. Bernadette and St. Therese) have participated wholeheartedly in community and charity events.

The Parish Life Center was constructed in 2003, which has become a focal point not only for Parish activities but for many community and family events. By selling 4.5 acres of land, we were able to pay the balance of our building debt.

Including those who have joined us after the closing of Our Lady of Fatima Parish in Lyons, Ohio, St. Caspar Parish now numbers about 750 households with nearly 2,500 members.


